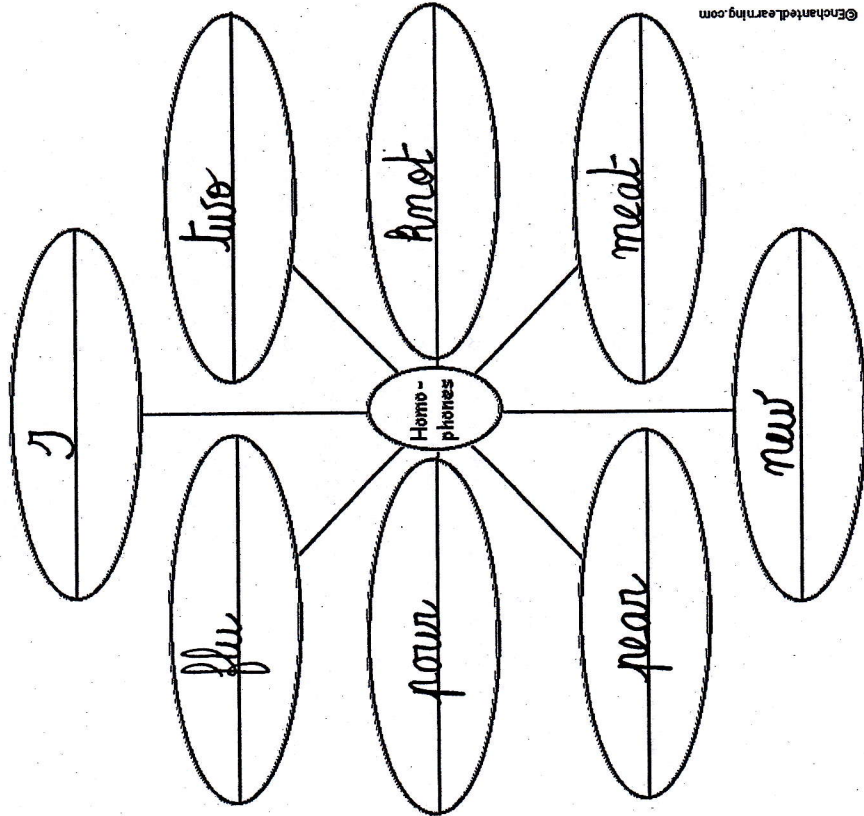


Homophones

Homophone Pair Game

All the cards are placed faced down, and students/small groups take it in turns to pick up two. If the two are homophones, they keep the two cards. The position of the cards must be kept as at the start to help the students remember where the cards are.
